brewery is
on the
Northern

edge of Algonquin Park, making Highlander one of the most northerly craft breweries in Ontario.

Highlander began operations in 2009 when Brewmaster Brian Wilson made the brewery's first beer, a traditional Scottish Ale. Using four varieties each of malt and hops, and cracking barley on site to ensure freshness, Highlander was soon a favourite of the region.

Highlander has expanded its line to four products with the addition of Twisted Spruce, Blacksmith Smoked Porter and Lion Grass Ale.

Not sure what tonight's selection will be.... here are some reviews of the Scottish ale:

Highlander Scottish Ale has a bright red almond colour with toasted malt, a hint of caramel, and a touch of fruit aromas. It has medium body, with coffee and chocolate flavours, nice hop balance and nutty finish.

650ml bottle pours amber in color with a finger and a half of white head that leaves

some spotted lacing on the glass. Aroma is caramel with some light smoke. Taste is a caramel malty sweetness with a herbal bitterness and a light smoky finish. Light to medium bodied with moderate carbonation. A decent brew for the style, but there are better ones out there.

Canmoore (221) - Ottawa, Ontario, CANADA - APR 26, 2014

Pours a rich amber with a thin tan head, aroma includes smoke, nuts, toffee, fruits and tannins. Taste includes rich toasty malts, fruity, hoppy, and a nutty finish. Not bad at all!

650 ml bottle from LCBO. Nice enough, drinkable beer. Nothing extraordinary, however. Nice dark brown ale, with very little head and light carbonation. Very watery mouthfeel, and malty in flavour. I liked it, but no more or less than many other examples of ales out there.

This is a very well made, bright and fresh riesling that is actually not as sweet as the "semi-dry" designation might indicate. Look for youthful grapefruit/lemon, green pear and petrol aromas and flavours, but they are not very intense. It's light to medium bodied, crisp, tart and lemony on the finish. Always a great value, the Vineland Semi-Dry Riesling offers crunchy apple, melon, floral and pear notes on the nose. While off-dry, this Riesling has a tart lemon candy and green apple edge that brings acidity and, as a result, some length while never becoming cloying in the residual sugar department.

I find myself to be a waffler when it comes to Vineland Rieslings: sometimes I'm a fan of the Dry version and in other years I find myself drawn to the Semi-Dry ... the 2010 is definitely a Semi-Dry kinda year ... but don't get all hung to on the semi-dry name because here's it really is just a name. There is a nice sweet entry but it's after the initial taste that this wine shines it's brightest and best. The acidity is so well balanced that you'll forget all about that sweet entry the moment it hits the mid-to-back palate ... there's a Country Time Lemonade tartness in the middle before it finishes with big acid and green apple ... sweet entry, tart finish and delicious length ... this is

summertime in a glass - now buy a bottle and find yourself a patio. Price: \$13.95 - Rating: ****

I've enjoyed previous vintages of this solid Vouvray much more, and the tricky 2012 vintage has shaped a lighter, less ripe version. A hint of quince and apple peeks through wooly, medicinal notes. Mushroom, celery salt and green fruit flavours dominate a slightly off-dry honeyed finish. Tasted September 2013. Rhys Pender, MW

Chenin Blanc is underrated and can come across in many different styles from steely dry to honeyed sweet. This is of the slightly off-dry style with honey, tropical fruits, cantaloupe, pineapple and hints of bees wax and damp straw. The hint of sugar on the palate is more than balanced by the high acidity and then honey, pineapple, lemon, peach, hay and baking spice notes linger on the finish. Great value, only 11.5% alcohol but feels rich yet refreshing at the same time. (Tasted Mar 2014)

Classic Vouvray from the Loire, with sweetly gentle flavours. Aromas of white peach, chalk, yellow apple and acacia lead into flavours of ripe cling peach, melon and a hint of tangerine on the finish. Absolutely delicious!

The Bougrier has myriad mineral notes (calcaire, chalk, limestone, wet crushed gravel) in the aromas and flavours, with a slightly sweet mouth feel very characteristic of Vouvray. It's seductive and charming and would also chime with a big bird — but lobster, king crab or shellfish are even better dishes to play with as main-dish alternatives on Thanksgiving.
